



## How would you spend £13,000 on sport in Beer?

Beer's residents, sports clubs, voluntary groups and other organisations are being given a final opportunity to send in their ideas on how to spend £13,000 on outdoor sports facilities in the parish.

Ideas already received include additional football goals/improved football area at Ashill, canoe/ kayak/paddleboard storage on the beach, fixed table tennis tables on the beach. If you have any other ideas, let us know.

The funds – Section 106 money - have been collected by East Devon District Council from housing developments in the parish; the council has a clear policy of ensuring that residents and parish councils decide how the money is spent.

Ideas can include all sorts of outdoor sports from outdoor gym equipment to works being carried out at a cricket or football pitch.

Proposals must be for:

- New outdoor sports facilities or to improve existing outdoor sports facilities.
- Permanently sited sports facilities and equipment. For example football goals, courts or training areas, so not for movable equipment like cricket bats, kayaks or tennis rackets.
- Sports facilities or equipment that is open and accessible to the community. A small fee may be charged but it must be affordable.

Funding cannot be spent on buildings, indoor facilities, professional sports grounds or golf courses.

**All ideas must be submitted to Beer Parish Council by noon on Wednesday 19 June 2019 at the latest.** Please send your name, your contact details, information on what your proposal is and an estimate of how much funding your project would need if you know. We can then contact you for further information if we need to. Once we've received all the extra proposals we'll work with East Devon District Council to see if they're eligible, affordable and possible. Residents will then be given a chance to look at all the ideas that can happen and vote on them. The eligible ones that gain the most votes are where the money will be spent.



## How would you spend £13,000 on play in Beer?

Following an initial consultation with the community of Beer, the following three main themes/priorities for 'play' were identified:

1. Improvements/additions at the Ashill Playpark;
2. Create a new, small play area on the levelled area of the Beer Head car park, exploring more creative/natural play provision;
3. Improve a number of health and safety aspects of the Jubilee playpark; including, but not limited to, making access easier by creating a ramp at the entrance in place of the steps, and addressing issues with the entrance gate. *(NB this would **not** be for the substantial design proposal to transform this play area which is being progressed separately.)*

Beer Parish Council invite all residents (of all ages) to get in touch with us to indicate which of these three options you would most like to see progressed. This will help inform the decision of the Parish Council. Whichever option is progressed, a formal consultation will then be undertaken to decide the specifics involved. This consultation will be led by East Devon District Council, who will meet and consult with the children of Beer.
