From Justin...

Hello!

As May turns to June on the march into summer, the sun forces new life up from the earth, lighter mornings and evenings, stunning sunsets and twinkling stars glimmer in the clear night sky as we sit upon the seashore of our beautiful coastal parishes. It's like a symphony of light and warmth that buoys our spirits.



The first weekend of June in 2022 also marks two very significant events. The first of these is the Queen's platinum Jubilee, for which celebration events are being planned in communities across the country. Across Seaton and Beer there are many activities taking place throughout the extended bank holiday weekend from Thursday through to Sunday, offering a chance to meet friends, old and new, and bring our communities together.

This is the first time that any British monarch has celebrated a Platinum Jubilee, and after 70 years on the throne very few of us will even be able to remember anything other than living in Elizabethan times.

The Queen's reign has been marked by almost unimaginable changes in society and in the world. Her coronation was credited with kickstarting the television age, now screens are just about everywhere. Her first Christmas broadcast in 1952 was only on the radio, her latest in 2021 could be watched on TikTok or heard on Amazon Alexa!

The Queen has been a constant presence in an ever-changing world and it is testament to her humility and service that, though scandals may have rocked her family and a great number of her governments, the Queen herself remains steadfast and an inspiration to many including me.

Though the majority of her coronation was shown on television, there was one moment that was deemed too sacred to broadcast (even that is a decision that you can't imagine television executives making today!). This was the moment when the symbols of her status – the crimson robe, the diamond diadem, the coronation necklace – were removed, and the Archbishop of Canterbury anointed the new Queen with holy oil.

The Queen has spoken since of how this moment was the most significant in her life, as she dedicated herself to a life of service, as one called to follow the example of Jesus who himself gave his life for others. Throughout her reign, the Queen has been public about her Christian faith and how it has both sustained and inspired her, evidently displayed throughout her life in her words and actions.

It is fitting then that the other significant celebration taking place on the first weekend in June is the feast of Pentecost. This is when we remember the gift of God's Holy Spirit to the Church, that Spirit of love and service which binds all people together and fills each and every one of us with the guiding presence of God.

The early Christians, after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, dedicated their lives to one another. As the Acts of the Apostles puts it, "All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all that there were no needy persons among them."

As we approach this weekend with its multitude of celebrations may we all be inspired – whether by the Holy Spirit, by the many years of humble service of her Majesty the Queen, or both – to dedicate our lives to the service of our fellow people, in our own communities and around the world.

Hurrah! There is now water in two of the fish tanks and we plan to make use of the Spring tides next week to find a few critters to populate them. The

Trustees decided that the reorganisation of the tanks should wait until next winter. Filling the tanks is always a bit fraught, but this year everything went swimmingly and the process was made much easier by using the landing stage – thanks Paul.

The Centre is open daily, with one of the Trustees unlocking the door when on their early morning dog-walk. If you'd like to help by closing the building at the end of the day, please get in touch. Ten years ago we ran a project asking people for their recollections of the Queen's Coronation in 1953. Her Platinum Jubilee gives us an opportunity to re-visit those memories. If you can add to the collection in the folder which is in the Centre, we'd be delighted.

Beer Village Heritage is continuing to contribute a monthly "Pebbles People" video for the Jurassic Coast Trust's celebrations for their 20th anniversary. During the summer we're inviting everyone to decorate a luggage label, tie it onto a stone with a hole through it and add it to a collection at the Centre. The decoration, in words or pictures or both, should reflect what the pebble means to you. The contributions so far have been really imaginative. They include drawings, photos, poetry and prose.

I'm rather pleased that May is coming to an end. "No Mow May" is all very well, but the paths which we keep through the longer grass are very overgrown with the tall wild daisies (which I call Esther reeds) coming into flower. We've also discovered a slight downside to the increase in insects – the cat has collected a tick. So we need to make sure that we are wearing trousers as well as socks and shoes when out in the garden. So far this hasn't been a problem as the weather hasn't been conducive to shorts and sandals!

Baby bats are still at risk of crash landing or flying too close to the ground, so please continue to keep your cats indoors overnight during June. If you have access to a bat detector, this is a good time of year to listen for these fascinating mammals and try to identify them.

A pair of goldfinches have set up home in one of the pittosporums and we've been watching nuthatches looking for insects in a pile of wood. Although we have several pairs of blue and great tits, none of them appear to have taken advantage of any of the bird boxes which we have put up for them. The male pheasants are strutting around the garden looking very fine in their Spring plumage. Their hens are enjoying dust baths in the flower beds – annoying when they flatten cherished plants!

“In Conversation With ...”

No. 6, In Conversation ...with John and Di Lang



Who remembers Robot Wars? Do you? Not a lot of people know this, -- and we discovered it on the day we manage to drag John and Di Lang away from dead-heading the daffs outside St Michael’s Church – the star of the show and 2004 UK Champion of Robot Wars was “Kronic the Wedgehog,” designed and built by this month’s Conversation Guests,

John and Di Lang. More of that later.

It’s an overcast March day when we manage to have a few minutes in the Anchor with the couple who more than anyone else are responsible for the trail of colourful blooms that light up Beer Village Main Street every Summer.

John: I’m a Beer boy. Born in 1947 in Lamorna Terrace opposite the graveyard.

Di: And my father was also a Beer boy, but he moved away up north. I was born in Nottingham, and we came back to Beer each year on holiday. This is where John and I met. It was a holiday romance. We’ve been married 49 years. Our two boys, Steven and David are also Beer lads.

John: Before I retired in 2012 I was a tool maker. I did my apprenticeship with Shands in Axminster. Then I worked for 42 years at Ceramtec in Colyton; I was foreman of the workshop there.

Di: And I did a couple of short stints, working at the shell shop on Seaton seafront, and then at Racal in Seaton for a couple of years.

Q: You two are probably the most recognised faces in the village. All those flower-troughs that span the brook, the flower beds in front of St Michaels, the pots standing at strategic points in the village, and the long-boxes hanging on the Jubilee fence– your work brightens up the whole face of the village.

John: Not just us. Anne and Dave Oxley and Liz Asbury and Hilary and Adrian Deakin, they all work for the Horticultural Society. And two more vital people are Audrey Tims, our fund raiser and treasurer, and Avril Cook, our Secretary. Of course a lot of credit goes to Ursula Makepeace. I’m the

Chairman of the H C at the moment. I've also been on the Regatta Committee for 50 years. And then there's Beer Football Club. I started playing for Beer when I was 13 and carried on playing till I was 35. Then I managed the Reserves. I've served on the Football Committee for more than 60 years.

Q: It's fair to say there's a competitive streak in what you do?

John: Definitely. Sailing – I used to sail a Sea-Skater catamaran here off Beer beach. And also a Scorpion. Then there's chrysanthemum-growing. I used to show at Yeovil and Weston-super-Mare. We've done well in the South West-in-Bloom Competition in the past. They're pressuring us to return to the competition now. We definitely need younger people to join the Horticultural Society, specially to do the co-ordinating and the organising of the competition process.



Q: Now what about those Robot Wars?

John: Ah, well! That was back in the 1990s. I built "Kronic the Wedgehog" in the workshop, where I was foreman. We took part for several years in the television Series 4 to 7. Then we were part of the spin-off tour; it was a road show and we went all over the country. We

won the 2004 Championship. Our machine, "Kronic," was powerful enough to throw off two other competitors at a time; it could flip a 100 kilogramme weight 8 feet up into the air. We sold that machine to a competitor who renamed it Apollo and took it to America.

Di: I painted the foam spikes on it (because it looked like a hedgehog). On tour, we used to give the spikes away as mementos to children.

Committees – Football, Regatta, Horticulture – all quiet unassuming work going on in the background, all of it effort that feeds into the fabric of Beer village. You come away from a conversation with John and Di Lang with one overall impression: Beer is incredibly lucky to have this modest, self-effacing couple giving their time not only to shaping the life of the village, but to filling Beer with colour for its residents and its visitors. One senses that the show-biz days are not quite over. Chatting done, they go back to de-heading the daffodils in a flower bed inside an old boat that's gone aground outside St Michael's.

“Stillness? Ah, but the trouble is, you see, I’m never still, am I? Why? Because I’ve got stuff to think about, stuff to be done, people to see, jobs waiting. And I’ve got to be ready for the future. Tonight. And tomorrow. The weekend, next week, next month. Things to prepare for. Decisions to be taken. Stillness? No way. When does that happen? Any moment of any day you could say to me “What’s happening?” and I’d say, “I’ve got a mountain of stuff to think about. My mind is fully loaded, my mind is constantly on the move.”

All of which means you are always reacting and responding. You’re skidding about on the surface of daily existence, dealing with an unending flow of mental content. And it never ends. You may have moments here and there when you seem to come to a standstill, but they don’t last. To be honest, you have this appetite, this momentum, this addiction to thinking, and you don’t stop. You’re never really still. That is your conditioning.

“Can I help it? I’m the product of the society and the culture I’ve grown up in. I’m conditioned by my race, language, upbringing, education. I am conditioned by my desires and ambitions, they’ve shaped my mind, shaped the person I am. Daily life is demanding! I’m conditioned by daily life!”

Many human beings live like this all the time. Rarely are they in touch with the essence of who they are, their deepest self. And yet beneath the noisy mind, beyond the endless train of thinking, there is the still calm dimension that is the essence of you. The essence of you has nothing to do with the circumstances of your life and everything to do with your state of consciousness.

Mind is finite, limited, conceptual, memory-dependent. Stillness takes you beyond mind. Stillness arises when you study a flower without thinking about it, when you watch clouds without judgement, when you allow presence to arise with no response or reaction. Stillness is now and is timeless. Stillness is at the core of you, and so it allows the essence of you to arise. That is why being still does you more good than is possible to put into words. Stillness opens you to wisdom beyond the limited confines of mind.



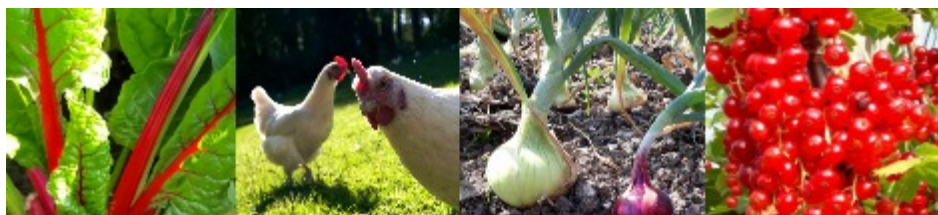
