

Rev's Ramblings

I used to live near a World's Strongest Man (WSM) competitor and former British champion. As a big fan of the annual WSM competition shown on Television each Christmas, often from rather exotic locations, it was quite surreal having this real-life strongman living round the corner. I recall seeing him as I returned home from a run feeling really worn-out but imagining he had probably been pulling trucks around a car park somewhere.

The final event of the WSM competition is the Atlas Stones, a race to lift 5 huge

awkward globe like stones weighing from 100-160kg each onto ascendingly higher platforms. The current world record is a whopping 273kg, currently held by Scotland's Tom Stoltman! It's exhausting thinking about it.

Easter Sunday we are reminded of another giant stone. A giant stone that had been mysteriously rolled away. A stone that opened the way to a tomb, a tomb where the body of the crucified Jesus had been laid to rest just 3 days before.


Put yourself in that scene, that distant Sunday morning. Two women rose early, the horrors of the cross still etched in their minds, as they took a walk to the tomb and they are met by a mysterious stranger sat on top of that great stone saying; "He is not here, he is risen"! Shock and terror, you can feel the intensity of their emotions, fear and great joy, could it be true? And they are told to "come, see", to look for themselves the place where he lay.

In the rolling away of that stone, you too are invited to "come and see". Not simply to see the cross where Jesus had died. Not simply to see the empty tomb where Jesus lay.

Not simply to see a church, people singing and praying.

Not simply to see hear the Easter story, "he is risen, he is risen indeed"!

But to actually come and see for yourself, to come to see the risen Jesus, to meet him for yourself.



The stones of doubt, Jesus wants to roll that aside and step into that place. Those parts of you that are broken, Jesus wants to roll those stones aside and step into that place and restore you.

The stones of pain and of grief, Jesus wants to roll those stones aside, and bring comfort and strength, walking with you through that journey.

The stones of fear and uncertainty about tomorrow, Jesus wants to roll those stones aside and breathe his peace into that place and say with the authority only he can assert; "do not be afraid, for I am with you always".

At Easter we look to Jesus Christ, the Son of God, because he has ultimately defeated death. Because he wants to roll away the stones in front of our hearts that are stopping us from living life in its fullness. To breathe life in those places, to come and dwell in those places through the Holy Spirit that is promised for all that place their trust in him and what he has done.



Village Clock

Do you ever look at the clock on the church?
Would you miss it if it ceased to work? What you may not be aware of, is the fact that, although it is situated on St Michael's Church, the clock actually belongs to the village, and whilst the church organises access for servicing etc., it is the Parish Council that pays for servicing etc.
Unfortunately, the most

recent service has shown that extensive work is now required to keep it running for the next hundred years or so, and it has been suggested that the clock face itself would also benefit from restoration.

The amount quoted to undertake <u>all</u> the work is in the region of £10,000 which neither the local parish council, nor the church can afford. Is there somebody out there who would be willing to launch an appeal to raise such an amount? I am mindful that this wonderful village managed to raise an enormous sum for a new church roof back at the turn of this century, so hope some enthusiastic person may say "Let's do it!" and organise something to help raise funds? didn't live up to its description of "fill ditch" – March has had more that it's fair share of rain, and we're currently experiencing the equinoctial gales.

March came in "like a lamb" so we should expect it to go out like a lion. Once it stops raining it will be good to get out in the garden with some seeds.

Beer had a very special visitor a couple of weeks ago

when a sea eagle came for a look around. A photograph of it dwarfing a buzzard shows the size of this bird. They were reintroduced to the Isle of Wight a few years ago, and some have subsequently moved to Poole Harbour. Another name for them is erne, or ern – very useful for crossword puzzles!

We went for a wander along the side of the Exe recently and watched a spoonbill arrive and preen himself. There are a number of breeding pairs in the Exe estuary, but they still appear as rather exotic animals! At home, the bird feeders are attracting blue, great, and long-tailed tits along with chaffinches and goldfinches. The robins and sparrows prefer to collect food which has fallen from the feeders and wrens hunt in the flower pots. The pigeons have been joined by a hen pheasant who presses her beak to the glass door if there's no seed in the ground feeder. She's taken to sleeping right up against the door. The green woodpecker has been busy on the trunk of the palm tree.

Beer Village Heritage has agreed to join other history groups in the area to make an exhibition of life over the past 60 years to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the East Devon Area of Natural Beauty. We collected a few ideas for themes to research at our recent coffee morning, and any more thoughts or relevant pictures that we could use to illustrate our presentation from you would be most welcome. The exhibition will be in the summer, and we'll give more details in due course. The coffee morning gave us the opportunity to show the collection of postcards of Beer which has been given to us. As there are several duplicates, we were happy that people wanted to take some of them.

Once again, we enjoyed a day in the open air handing out water to the Grizzly runners. The weather was cold and dry, at least until we had packed up and sorted out the recycling. The atmosphere is always so uplifting, with the camaraderie and good spirits of the runners infecting us all.

The Fine Foundation Centre will be open for Easter and we are currently refreshing some of the exhibits. We plan to fill the fish tanks before opening and will organise a rock-pooling session when the tides are suitable. Hopefully we'll be able to find some beasties to occupy the tanks. Keep an eye out for posters giving details.

At the March Branscombe talk Professor Naomi Sykes gave us a very different slant on the re-wilding debate by looking at what is "native" and what is not. Professor Sykes is a zooarchaeologist who specialises in examining and interpreting animal remains at archaeological sites, and she showed us that many of the animals which we might assume are native to Britain originated elsewhere. Even the humble chicken has only been here for 5000 years or so, was originally revered and definitely not eaten for dinner! If we go back before the last Ice Age, bears lived here, retreating southwards before the ice and not returning. So, should we reintroduce everything? Or only the "good" animals and plants? The next Branscombe talk, on Monday 10th April is about the Burnt House at Weston, so will bring us back to more local events. Please note – this talk is on Easter Monday.

Even though the centre is closed, you can still see the exhibits in the display cases underneath the building and you can also access the Beer Village Heritage walks and I-Spy online via our website: http://www. beervillageheritage.org.uk/. You can telephone us on 01297 20858 or via beervillageheritage@yahoo.co.uk. You'll find litter pickers outside the Fine Foundation Centre which you are welcome to use. There are recycling bins by the Centre and general rubbish bins outside Charlie's Yard.

Beer Village Heritage is a registered charity and is run entirely by volunteers. As well as running the Fine Foundation Centre we head up and support projects suggested by you as well as offering walks and talks on the local area. Do get in touch if you have any comments or ideas to take forward.



In our previous report in the March edition of the Beer Parish news it was reported that the donation from Beer Parish Council had been given to support the repairs to the church clock, please could we just clarify that it is not the church clock it belongs to the village and is just housed in the church, please accept our apologies for any misunderstanding caused.

The Council are also delighted that they will be supporting Beer Horticultural Society again this year, with a donation of £275.00, all the Councillors commented on what an amazing job they do in keeping Beer looking beautiful!

The Parish Council are looking for volunteers! Beer Parish Council and East Devon District Council are super excited to begin our plan for Jubilee Gardens in Beer to achieve Green Flag status in 2024. The Green Flag Award scheme recognises the highest accolade of a green space, and sets the benchmark standard for the management of recreational outdoor spaces across the United Kingdom and around the world. Our intention is for Beer Jubilee Gardens to be the 5th Green Flag site in East Devon, joining Seaton Wetlands, Seafield Gardens (Seaton), Connaught Gardens (Sidmouth) and Manor Gardens (Exmouth). This will mean that 3 out of the district's 5 Green Flag sites will be in the east of the district. Green Flag status will require EDDC to produce a sustainable management plan that seeks to preserve the site's historical beauty and ecological diversity while simultaneously laying the foundation for sustainable, low impact maintenance. Successfully gaining Green Flag status will not only help bring our beloved Jubilee back up to full repair but could also provide access to heritage funding to assist with the restoration and improvement of the Gardens' features and facilities, such as its hard landscaping, to restore the Gardens' former glory. Maybe you're comfortable with it. You might welcome an end, if yours is or has been a troubled and a painful life. Or maybe you take the lesson from the natural world. Cycles of germination and decay and rebirth. Life appearing in this world in multiple forms, and then disappearing. It is both wonderous and heart-breaking. Life requires us to see that, and feel that, so that it deepens you. So that you become wise.

Away from the surface of this earth, the beautiful mystery of death comes close to the properties of Infinite Space that surrounds us.

In the unimaginable vastness and timescale of the unfolding universe, nothing dies. There is only continual transformation. In deep space giant gas clouds give birth to stars that burn through their lives with heat and light. They form, live through a nuclear fusion-cycle, then they fade and disintegrate, only to give their material to the formation of new stars. They do this over billions upon billions of years, but which in the timeless dimensions of the universe is eternity.

We lose those we love and we grieve the loss. Yet even as we grieve for what was close to us here on the microcosmic scale, we can still acknowledge a dimension in the vastness of the universe where 'death' is no more than an essential stage in the cyclical appearance and disappearance and reappearance of stars. We are the Universe and the Universe does not die, it simply reforms.






