# From Justin...

### **Rev's Ramblings**

Christmas and new year blessings to you!

I write this final ramble of 2022 and first of 2023 aware that when it is received, Christmas for many will be a distant memory. The decorations will be coming down, the leftover turkey devoured and all but a few lonely toffee pennies left behind in the Quality Street jar (perhaps a Bounty or two if Celebrations are your sort of thing). However, in the Christian Calendar, Christmas still has a way to go, for the



party continues until the 6<sup>th</sup> of January. It is then the festival of Epiphany begins, a season which celebrates the revelation of God in flesh - Jesus Christ. Epiphany commemorates principally (but not solely) the visit of the Magi to the Christ Child, the wise wanderers searching for the new born king.

My prayer for you all this Christmas and new year, is that amidst any uncertainty in our world, you may find great comfort, security, and reassurance in the promises of God, promises fulfilled in the coming of Jesus Christ, of whom the prophets declared, the angels rejoiced, the Magi sought and the psalmists sang.

The end of one year and the beginning of a new year are a naturally reflective time. The inevitable transition causes us to look back on what has past and set our goals and hopes for the year ahead. Parts of 2022 may not have gone quite as we hoped. Many of us will have experienced disappointments, been forced to adjust our plans, or to make tough financial decisions amidst a cost-of-living squeeze.

But, for all of us too, if we think carefully, 2022 had many joys, new beginnings and transformation, extraordinary acts of human kindness, deep-hearted generosity, blessings from unexpected places and provision. Moments of gratitude, affection and thankfulness and a rejoicing coming together where we could see smiling faces, hidden once by masks.

We step into each new year, like a new page or chapter in our lives, as we might see in our diaries or on our calendars. There is great value in pressing the pause button to reflect and remember. What was it like? Where did we see God's hand?

The new year is an opportunity for each of us to make a fresh start, make plans and to reignite our enthusiasm. I believe that in Jesus Christ each one of us can make a new start on any day of the week, month or year. A new beginning that starts with a change of direction toward him where we discover a true hope and joy, not based on external circumstances, but from a relationship with the living God, a joy that was won on the cross and in which true eternal hope is discovered.

And it is through this step, the catalyst for the greatest transformation begins, as you receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, the very presence of God with you always.

None of us can predict this new year ahead, but we can be assured about what God is going to do in the present and the future, because we can trust the amazing things He has done in the past. What he has done in the past tells us who God is today and it's a promise of what God wants to do in the future, so may we rest secure in His love.

I close 2022 with the poignant words of the poem 'God Knows' written by Minnie Louise Haskins and famously broadcast by HM King George VI as part of his 1939 Christmas broadcast:

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way." So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.

And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East.

# Fine Foundation Centre I'm writing this in a post-

Beer Village Heritage Reg. Charity No.1087162 I'm writing this in a post-Christmas haze. It was lovely to be able to get out on the beach on Christmas Day, when the tide was right for a visit to the Halls.

Boxing Day saw us meeting friends on Church beach at Lyme Regis for a fossicking session. Our finds included some "golden" ammonites along with a couple of Shippams fish paste jars from the rubbish dump!

Thanks to everyone who picks up litter on the beach on a regular basis, it looks as though the Beach Clean on New Year's Day will be concentrating on little pieces of plastic, along with the ubiquitous fishing line. However, the strong on-shore winds forecast for this week could change all that. Folk lore says that the wind direction on the shortest day will dominate until Candlemas, so it appears that we can look forward to south/ southwesterlies for January. At least that should put paid to ice and snow!

The Fine Foundation Centre will close after the Beach Clean, and we plan to re-open on Good Friday. That gives the volunteers who open and close the building a bit of a break as well as offering the opportunity to refresh the exhibits.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed to the hag-stone collection. Once the centre has closed we'll create an archive of the tags and re-use the stones. Even though the centre will be closed, you can still see the exhibits in the display cases underneath the building. The first Branscombe Project talk of 2023 will be on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> January, in the Branoc Hall, when Patrick Dillon will be looking at livestock farming in Mongolia. The Project's "Smallest Museum in the South West" is on show at the Sea Shanty, so do spend a few minutes there on your walk along the coast path.

The cold snap during December reminded us that the birds need food and water. As a result, we've had small flocks of long-tailed tits descending on the feeders along with blue and great tits, nuthatches and gold finches. The wren was busy in the flower pots, and several robins appeared and were apparently being friendly to one another. The ever present pigeons were

happy to stretch up to one of the feeders.

Not much work done in the garden this month. We decided not to sow broad beans this autumn as the mice have eaten them and the new plants for the last couple of years. No red onion sets sown either.



The Beer Parish Council met on the 9<sup>th</sup> November with the gratefully received introduction to our new Parish Clerk, Nicky Ingarfield. Nicky has fantastic experience and will be an asset to the Parish team and Beer village.

A notable item presented was our support for, and of, the Beer Community Larder team with assistance from Tesco. The facility will shortly be available at different venues throughout Beer, so please keep an eye out.

Other items discussed at the meeting were the ongoing traffic survey, Jubilee planting, and the upcoming Blue Flag for Beer beach, as well as the use of an electronic card machine for donation funded events. That said, the larger item was the upcoming consultation on Dog friendly zones/times on Beer beach. The Council had limited backing for the new proposals to allow dogs on both sides of the beach before 9am and after 6pm, citing the normal issues, plus an over-complication of the existing rules.

On Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December Seaton residents Mary Casey & Rev. Ali Finch, were commissioned as 'Anna Chaplains' at St David's Church in Exeter in a special service led by the Bishop of Crediton. An Anna Chaplain is a dedicated minister for the elderly and those on the



dementia pathway.

Anna Chaplaincy is one of the Leading UK charities offering training and networking for older people's ministry and enables local churches to offer high-quality spiritual care to older people across the community, who may be of strong, little or no faith. A ministry of the Bible Reading Fellowship, the aim is to make sure that the older generation has as much of a link with their local church, as they would wish too, or simply a listening ear and a hand offered in friendship. Mobility, ill-health, cognitive difficulties, or a move to a care home does not mean their communal and personal spiritual life comes to an end.

Mary and Ali recently completed their specialist training and join a network of around 250 Anna Chaplains in the UK. Specifically, they will be both be serving the communities of Seaton and Beer, where the population of over 65s is above the national average, alongside the significant number of local care homes, with many more people being cared for at home or living alone.

The name Anna Chaplain, comes from the widow, Anna, who appears with Simeon in Luke's gospel; both are good role models of faithful older people. Both Ali and Mary are connected to the churches of the Coastal Mission Community, St Gregory's in Seaton and St Michael's in Beer. Priest-in-Charge Revd Justin Montague said;

'It was a special service to formally commission Ali and Mary, who both have share a passion and calling into this vitally important ministry and between them, have a great depth of experience pastorally, spiritually and in supportive care provision for older people. We are pleased to support Ali and Mary as they reach out to support and share God's love and care with the older generation across our communities.

It's a troubled world. There is plague. Starvation. War ravages the lives of millions. Comfortable living standards are no longer assured. Planet Earth and all the living creatures on it are afflicted. You see this and I see this and we cannot change any of it. We cannot stop the unfolding of events on the world scale. The only thing we each of us have control over is our own consciousness: the way we think -- or choose not to think -- about events, and the decisions that follow. We can control our thinking and behaviour.

It's a small step from being unconscious to 'waking up'. When you live unconsciously you are lost in thinking, distracted, unaware; you do not see the consequences of your actions because your attention is located in a fictitious future, or a non-existent past. Waking up out of unconscious living is one small but crucial evolutionary step for humanity. 'Waking up' in daily living means bringing stillness into your life and becoming aware of the spaciousness of the present moment. This inner stillness, which is the absence of thought, which has brought the momentum of incessant connected mental activity to a standstill, is the essential you, is the state that comes closest to the essence of who you are. For many people this essence is covered up by thinking. What a colossal evasion that is! However, you break that continuum when you become still, when you hold your attentive awareness in the present moment -- when you cease to have an argument with whatever the present moment contains, that is, when you accept Now. You can do this when you sense the abundant depths of the present moment.

Whatever your own life circumstances happen to be, whatever job you do or responsibilities you carry, you are in your inmost core a point of conscious awareness. If you can 'wake' to that fact, if you are able to live each day staying connected to Presence, aware of the depth in you which opens and accepts the present moment, then you change the world. You have attuned yourself to the flow of life, you have opened inner stillness and so your perceptions and your sympathies and your decisions come out of the intelligence of Presence, which is an infinitely deeper source of wisdom than the memory-filled mind.

The state of the world is the responsibility of every person. You feed the light of consciousness into the world with your awakened consciousness.


