From Justin... Rev's Ramblings -

If you are hosting a dinner party this summer or perhaps some friends or acquaintances over for a barbecue, here are some controversial conversation topics that are likely to dampen the party atmosphere and we are well advised to avoid:

- Money
- Politics
- Religion
- Relationships

I think I have probably covered three of those four in some way or form during previous rambles. As we are not gathered around a table with a lasagne and a bottle of red, I shall go for the full set today...

...because we are of course on the countdown to election day! In Just a few days this month we'll all be asked to have our say on who we want as our local MP (Sidmouth and Honiton), and our thoughts on who we desire to be governing the UK.

It's easy to have strong feelings on these matters- and it's right and good to have the integrity, honesty and grace to be able to discuss things and disagree about political stuff with one another, whilst also being able to be friends with those with whom we might disagree. But before we dive into ticking or crossing a box, let's think about just two points from the teaching of Jesus- the importance of honesty, and of kindness.

Thinking of honesty, our mind might go to the Sermon on the mount, in Matthew 5, when Jesus says this:

"And do not take an oath by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. Let what you say be simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything more than this comes from evil."

And thinking of **kindness**, our mind might go to another parts of Jesus' teaching in Matthew 25 as he says the following:

Then the righteous will answer Him, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You something to drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? When did we see You sick or in prison and visit You?'

And the King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of Mine, you did for Me.'

Jesus' heart here is clear for the least, the last and the lost. There is a real sense here that the way we welcome the stranger instead of rejecting them, the way we treat the hungry rather than point the finger, and the way we serve the poor rather than ignore them, shows the depth of our love and worship to Jesus.

So this election season, we pray for all those who lead our country — whatever party they represent, whatever their political persuasion and whether they are right, left or central. And we pray for them to have a real depth of honesty and kindness, wisdom and discernment and that they may seek the common good in carrying out their duties.

And we acknowledge that, wherever we place our cross this election - there is one cross which is eternal. There is one cross which doesn't change every few years. There is one cross that has nothing to do with our preference, politics, or power. There is one cross on which we can place our lives and eternal futures. And this cross is all about Jesus - the God who is full of grace and truth, who is the way, the truth and the life, and whose word is 'yes' and 'Amen'.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWLETTER – JULY

On Monday 10th June, a village meeting was held to discuss the New Years Eve fireworks and was attended by a number of Beer Parish Councillors, along with three non- councillors.

In the previous two years, the shortfall to the funding was met by BPC, as they ran at a loss.

However, this cannot be sustained and due to legislation, funding can't be provided by BPC monies and has to be self-funding through fund raising and/or donations.

The event will also require at least ten stewards to ensure the safety of the public along with someone to "manage" all aspects such as stewarding, generation of paperwork (risk assessments) and liaising with EDDC.

It is sad to say, unless the above is resolved, there will not be any fireworks this New Year.

On a positive note – the D-Day events held on the 6th and 8th June were a resounding success – they were a massive joint village effort to put together and to say a big thank you to all those that served in the armed forces at the time.

Massive thank you's must go to Carole Arnold, the Royal British Legion, Beer Scouts, Beer Primary school, BPC, Tesco for donating the cream teas and of course all of community who turned out to make the days such memorable events.

Other village news – BPC are working hard with EDDC, DCC and Streetscene to ensure the village is maintained to a high standard, pot holes filled, drain covers painted, walls repaired, lighting repaired, flower pots replaced following damage by contractors.

Another defibrillator is to be purchased by BPC and is to be located on the external wall of The Mariners Hall – thank you to London Heart for assisting in the purchase.

Once the new defibrillator is purchased and installed a map of the village will be published showing the location of all the defibrillators.

Reminder – the next Beer Eats is scheduled for Friday 5th July – come on down and enjoy some street food, a drink and natter with some of the community or visitors to make them feel welcome.

On June 25th the monthly WI meeting had a talk given by Charlie Portlock in the Congregational Hall, Beer. Charlie represents **Partners for Progress**, started by Elizabeth Rutter, now 86 and still involved with the villages in Nepal. Elizabeth had first visited the Ladakh and Zanskar areas whilst on a summer teaching break in the early 1980's and was overwhelmed by the experience. When visiting Baglungpani village, the headmaster showed them their school which was in bad repair. That was the start of a collaboration between Elizabeth's school, Leweston, in Dorset, and Baglungpani.

Throughout the years the friendship between the schools has deepened with students spending time in their gap years there and with exchanges.

Elizabeth says, 'I myself have lost count of the number of visits to the village and it has been a delight to work with two headmasters over the years who have quietly led and inspired the work while preserving the special peace and joyous atmosphere which has touched the lives of so many visitors here.'

The charity was founded in 2019. Partners for Progress supports education and community through Nepal. It is a country caught between India and China whose infrastructure has been ruined from many years of political conflict.

Several WI members have donated to sponsor a child. This gives the child a future vision of what is possible and a chance of

education which in turn, helps their families.

The work of Elizabeth and Charlie has now expanded further to reach other communities. Elizabeth continues to go out to Nepal and takes an active part supporting them.

Fine Foundation Centre Beer Village Heritage

We're delighted that Julian Driver has started work on painting and decorating the Fine Foundation Centre. Covid 19 interrupted the maintenance

regime, so we are pleased to be getting back on track. To ensure the safety of the public, and to give Julian space, the centre will be closed while the work is being done. We apologise for any inconvenience and plan to be open again before the school holidays.

Hopefully the gloriously sunny weather will be maintained into the holiday period. At least the lack of rain is curtailing the growth of the grass, although the daisies are still blooming happily. Thrushes and blackbirds like you to keep your lawns trimmed. They prefer short grass when they are looking for worms, snails etc. Several people have commented on the large numbers of slugs which have appeared this year. I know that they have a bad press, but they are very useful in recycling dead plant material. Protect any precious plants and let the others take their chances! Incidentally, in spite of folk lore, I can't find any proof that coffee grounds deter slugs, but they do work well in your compost heap.

Midsummer has been and gone, and the evenings are starting to draw in! However, there's still plenty of "summer" wildlife to enjoy. The swifts are very active every evening, swooping across the garden in search of midges. July usually sees the emergence of glow worms. They usually light up as it gets dark, sometime after 2300, so going on a regular patrol tends to be the best way to identify where they are. If there are none in your garden you should be able to find some in the Jubilee Gardens and the "Living Churchyard" in the old cemetery. Juvenile glow worms don't maintain their light for long but flick on and off, so can be difficult to spot.

We were sad to lose one of our long-standing supporters, Soux White, who died recently. Soux enjoyed research projects, particularly supporting the Branscombe Project, and leaves her book on the Beer lace industry – Jane and Ada – as a worthy memorial.

The BAGs history group is looking at "water in Beer", and is hoping to find out more about the various large underground pipes around the village.

The annual Natural Seaton festival will be held on Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th July. There will be information stands and various activities across the town – most of them free. So do come along! It is followed on Monday 29th by activities celebrating Heath Week. The Pebblebed Heaths are one of our local National Nature Reserves and their website will have details in due course.

Daniel Wynn is the new manager for East Devon Natural Landscape. He's been busy getting to know the area as well as what the organisation covers. He is planning to meet local supporters and ambassadors early in July.

Don't forget: Seaton Library has a new Family History Club which meets on the first Friday of the month from 1030 - 1130.

As the holiday season approaches you might be looking for some different experiences. Stuart Line Cruises and Jurassic Coast Trust offers a trip along the coastline with expert guides pointing out some of the highlights of the world heritage site.


The documentary follows their lives and hopes as they train to compete on the global stage at the Tokyo Olympics.

D-DAY COMMEMORATIONS IN BEER

The 80th anniversary of D-Day was an event filled few days in the village. The RBL working side by side with the community and the 6th June commenced with the Proclamation and short Service of Remembrance by the Memorial. This was followed by the ringing of the Church bells at 6.30 and the lighting of the beacon on Jubilee Gardens at 9.15 by the Scouts.

On Saturday 8th June the day started with 40 Royal Marines from Lympstone Commando Training Centre yomping from Ladram Bay to Beer – 12 mile route over the coastpath, stopping at Sidmouth and Branscombe beach to meet veterans and then over the cliffs to Beer, where the RMs led by



the standard bearers from the Devons, Dorsets and Devon and Dorsets and RBL marched up the High Street to take the Royal salute from the Deputy Lieutenant Mr Robin Barlow.



All traversed into the church for a Service of Remembrance led by the Vicar Rev Justin Montague, Chairman of RBL Beer branch and

Royal Marine Chaplain. We were honoured to receive our VIP guest, Mr Joe Randall RAF veteran of Normandy and veterans from the village. The service was poignant made

emotional by the tones of the Last Post played by Fiona Harvey from Sidmouth Town Band. At one point our RAF veteran laid a cross by our



Memorial with just the words "Mac" written on. His mate who trained with him all those years ago, reached the beaches of Normandy and was then killed on the second day. Joe has never ever forgotten him.

The Parish Council then laid on an excellent cream tea, made possible by the generosity of Tesco Seaton and hosted by Beer Scouts. The afternoon was an opportunity for veterans to talk about their experiences in all conflicts and at one point we had the oldest – Joe Randall at 100



yrs and a serving Royal Marine's little son at 4 weeks old. It was truly a day for all ages to come together.

In the evening, the film club showed "The Longest Day".

This event was a real village community day with the Parish Council / Scouts / HM Coastguards/Church and so many villagers attending and helping. Special thanks to HM Coastguards and the two volunteers (First Aid) trawling the route to ensure no-one was injured. Thank you to everyone who assisted or just turned up.

There has been lots going on both in the background and foreground in our three 'Next steps' mission objectives, which are:

 - Who we are and the Good News we have to share
- 2. Making Disciples

Growing as followers of Christ

3. Creating Community

Broadening the age range of the church family to include especially Children and Families

Here I am just going to focus on 'Creating Community', that is our outreach work to children, families and youth and give you an update.

Thanks to Linda Joy

Firstly, some news. Linda Joy, who has been our children and families' worker for many years and leads Greg's and Mikey's Music Makers, is retiring at the end of the summer term to spend more time with her parents and growing family. Linda has been such a blessing to the Mission Community, with both our volunteers and especially to the countless and growing number children and families that have attended Music Makers. These ministries have been built on the foundation of great relationships, Linda's positivity and encouragement and she will be sorely missed by us all, and we offer our heart's full of gratitude and wish her and her family every blessing in this new season.

New initiatives

Earlier this year in March, Revd Shuna begin running one of her first 'Crafter-noon' sessions. These are outreach activities specifically aimed at children and families using crafts with Bible-based themes. There have been about four events already and they are growing in popularity each session. If you are interested in finding out more, seeing what goes on, do pop and have a chat with Revd Shuna.

As I write this, we are set to launch a new all-age service in St Gregory's Church Centre called the 'Early Bird' at on the third Sunday of the month. There will be a light breakfast served from 9.15am, followed by the service at 9.30am, including contemporary worship music and informal in style. At St Michael's church the team are investigating the possibility of starting a monthly 'Bubble Church' service. Intrigued, interested to find out, check

Support from Beyond the Mission Community

Revd Shuna and Revd Justin recently had a fantastic meeting with the Exeter Diocese Children and Families Mission Enabler, Sharon Blyth, to talk specifically about our mission objectives in this area, resources, funding streams and much more besides.

Our Mission Community has an ongoing commitment to the monthly Messy Church, held at the Methodist Church, but run by Christians Together in Seaton (CTiS). Revd Justin currently has responsibility on behalf of CTIS to ensure this runs well, supported by volunteers from our congregation. We have arranged for some critical team training from the central Messy Church (BRF) team to help the team to regroup and relaunch after the summer. The Diocese have stepped in to fund this.

Young People

Less than a quarter of churches in the UK have youth activities on a Sunday or during the week, leaving most churches wondering is it possible to start something and if so how and what. Youthscape's 'Launchpad is an answer to this challenge. In the first half of 2024 Revd Justin attended a new course called 'Launchpad', a new programme designed to give church leaders the insights, strategies and confidence they need to help the church take this step forward. Launchpad is a chance to see the possibilities that arise through innovation, informed strategy, and a renewed vision for youth work in church.

What's next for the Coastal Mission Community?

We are prayerfully and strategically discerning the opportunities in Seaton and Beer for youth, children and families work, how best to support this ministry and to make a huge difference in their lives. The potential is enormous and exciting, and the opportunities endless. We considering various options including employing a part-time youth, children and families minister, a gap year student, a young person on the South-West Youth Ministry (SWYM) pathway and more besides.

Where can you help?

Firstly, be praying. Be praying for discernment and wisdom as we seek a path forward and potential candidates.

Your Unhappiness

Unhappiness needs time if it is going to continue. It needs a story. It needs the mind to project back into the past (what happened) and forward into the future (what might yet happen). Unhappiness cannot survive in the present moment. Ask yourself: "Am I unhappy at this present moment, now?"

Holding your attention in the present moment means that all your thoughts and your actions are imbued with Presence. You're conscious of what you are thinking and doing. You have separated the essential you from the thoughts that are passing in the mind. You are not your thoughts. You are the space of consciousness in which thoughts arise.

Not all human beings are aware of this. Very many people identify with their thoughts -- to the extent that if someone challenges them, they are prepared to fight to defend them. Throughout human history people have died defending or attacking ideas which represent their identity. "Who or what am I without my identification with my ideas, beliefs, sympathies and judgements?"

This is why it is often said that the greatest event in any human life is the realization: "The essence of me is not my thoughts; I am conscious awareness; my life is not past or future but always here and now; the only reality is the timeless present moment."

What flows naturally from this realization is surrender and acceptance – you allow life to be what it is. Whatever life is giving you at this moment, you allow it. You accept the reality. If the present moment is causing suffering open your heart to it, allow the full import of what is happening into your being. You may not be able to change what happens in the world or in your life, but you can control your response to it. You can choose to not add more angry energy to a situation; you can choose to bring present-moment-awareness and all the outflow of love and sympathy that is in your being to the situation.

That is living in alignment with life. That is living alongside the intelligence of God, the Universe, Nature.


