years, published books and had us spellbound with his knowledge of poets, reciting many classics. These were interspersed with poems he had created.





### A FRIEND IN NEED



At the beginning of March there was a facebook post stating: "A walk home through the village yesterday evening. Such a warm feeling you get looking at how proud our church stands."

The appreciative person who wrote those words eloquently expresses what so many of us feel when we look at St Michael's Church. Our church is more than just an architectural gem where worship takes place, it is the HEART of our community. We have all gathered inside it for joyful celebrations or in sadness to say goodbye to loved ones. It is also the place where we get our hearts ready for Christmas, or stand in somber reflection on Remembrance Day. It is fair to say that our Church is always there for us whatever the occasion. However, in recent years the number of people attending services has diminished significantly. On a good

day there might be almost forty, on others barely twenty. We all have busy lives, with many commitments pulling us in every direction, and it is easy to skip church a Sunday or two; soon weeks become months, then years. I'm certainly guilty of that! We all assume there are others attending, so our absence would not matter...until it does.

The steady decline in support and attendance means that a small handful of people keep the Christian fire burning and have shouldered the financial burden of keeping our Church running. The most recent set of accounts highlights the steep running cost: an eye watering £58,199 to be precise. However, the total annual income is "only" £34,336, which means there's a shortfall of almost £24,000. At the current rate, our Church will not be able to survive more than 7 years.

Let that sink in. If we as a community do nothing to support the church, we will loose it in less than a decade! Imagine having a block of flats or terraced houses instead of St Michael's Church. Would we experience the same "warm feeling" walking past them?

I'm fully aware that our village is small, but what we lack in size, we make up for in community spirit! So let's do all we can to help St Michael's Church remain the heart of Beer. Attend a service, we'd love to see you! Become a Friend of St Michael's by placing a regular donation, volunteer to help in any of the many activities that take place every week, spare a prayer or, better yet, all of the above!

This is the time to stand up and be counted, otherwise we'll have to explain to future generations how we did nothing when St Michael's needed us.






