

From Justin... Rev's Ramblings -

In the last month, I have clocked up quite a few miles and not just on my feet!

I have raked up miles by bus, by rail, by air and by sea. One of those journeys was to Bahrain, as part of a small delegation from Exeter Diocese accompanying Bishop James. We were joined by representatives from the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf and Thika Diocese in Kenya, whom together we share a unique tripartite relationship, with the opportunity to worship, share and pray together, learn from each other and build upon our companion links.



Another, I travelled by sea to Normandy, to join the Royal Marines family, both serving, veterans and supporters, to remember the 79th anniversary of the D-Day landings and to lead services in memory of those who served in those world changing events.

In both of these significant trips, I felt a deep and profound sense of belonging and connection to something bigger than geographical boundaries or a particular time and place. Further, still there was a respect and deep relationship with others, as well as a shared collective mission and rich history, to which I felt I belonged.

I am reminded of the apostle Paul, as he too clocked up some huge miles 'Per Mare, Per Terram' ('by sea and by land' – the Royal Marines motto), as he sought to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, wide and far.

I am reminded of St Paul's first letter to the Corinthian church, who describes an astonishing picture of the different communities in the early church. Paul is highlighting the needs of the church in Jerusalem, another diverse community. Paul wants the Corinth Christians to understand and recognise their part in a shared mission and ministry. They are to understanding of their inter-connectedness with the wider body of Christ, despite the churches being geographically and culturally worlds apart.

When one church needs help the others play their part and this is as relevant for us today as it ever was, whether in the church or in the Royal Marines family through the work of the Royal Marines Association.

We think back to the first church described in the book of Acts and we see stories of their deep belonging, sharing, worshipping, growing and giving together. But I wonder as geography grew wider, that sense of belonging was made that more difficult. And perhaps that is the same for us?

Where we belong locally is of vital importance, but it's only part of a bigger picture. We're part of a mission community, a deanery, an archdeaconry, a diocese, a national church, a worldwide church and sometimes we need to be reminded of that, that we are part of something much bigger than our local context. That's why it's so exciting to build on our companion links and relationships. To share in the work that God is doing in other areas of the big C Church and for them to share in what is happening here. We demonstrate that commitment to other churches, as we pray for one another, we serve one another, we share and worship together, and give together towards a common fund.

As we broke bread together in Bahrain, whether in a home, a restaurant or at our Lord's table, there was a profound sense of our oneness in Christ that surpassed boundaries, cultural or geographical, that opens hearts and brings together. This was summed up following a traditional Bahraini breakfast and service of morning prayer, whereby Rev. John from Kenya gave a brief homily from Mark 3:31-25. He ended his talk by shaking hands with everyone at the table repeating Jesus words, 'you are my brother Bishop James', 'you are my sister Rev. Deborah' and so on, a powerful reminder of our unity in Christ as his Church.

So, I wonder what Paul would write to us today? Where we belong locally is of course important, but it's only part of a much bigger picture. And would Jesus see us living as God's family here on earth, as brothers and sisters in Him?


We are looking to discover the vision that God has placed for us here, our local interpretation of the Great Commission and Great Commandment and our diocesan vison to pray, grow, serve. God's calling to bring about his Kingdom here, where we live, and we all play our part in different ways.

How do we play our part, through prayer, through being interested and finding out what is going on elsewhere, sharing together. Through the way we give to our Common Fund, that allows the work of mission and ministry to take place.

God has a vision for us all and we all play our part in contributing to his kingdom being built here and well beyond our parish borders. Paul longs for the church in Corinth, to rejoice in the work of God in elsewhere and I wonder if we can discover that sort enthusiasm and excitement here and explore what playing our part means.

Beer Village Heritage Reg. Charity No.1087162 The grass hasn't grown much in this warm dry weather and the pollinators are appreciating the many daisy-like flowers both cultivated and wild. There have

been some lovely stands of poppies both in fields and gardens. I always think of them as being rather temperamental plants as seeds sometimes lie dormant for years, but the flowers always lift one's spirits. The lack of significant rain has meant that regular watering has been needed for the beans. Carrying the watering can is an excellent way of practising your weight-lifting!

July usually sees the first of the glow worms lighting up in its search for a mate. Go out of doors after 2200hrs and have a wander around



Common glow-worm, Lampyris noctiluca, is actually a species of beetle, not a worm at all. It's the flightless females that produce that bright eerie green glow to attract the flying males. Adults can't feed and only live for a week or two. The larvae can also glow, if only sporadically. The larvae feed on small snails, and live in the ground for 2 or 3 years before emerging as adults.

the garden or your local green area. The juveniles may only light up for a few seconds at a time, so can be difficult to spot. I haven't checked out the Jubilee for a couple of years but hopefully these ugly little worms are still in residence!

East Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty is celebrating its 60th anniversary this year. They are hosting a free exhibition in Kennaway House from Monday 17th to Saturday 22nd July. "From then to Now" comprises memories of communities and landscapes in East Devon, and includes a contribution from Beer Village Heritage which has been collated by David Morling. The exhibition is open from 1000 – 1600 daily.

In the meantime, the AONB's Partnership event focuses on water, and we're looking forward to learning more about the catchment areas and work being done on waste water. It will also be an opportunity to check out progress on the Lower Otter restoration. Hopefully you've all taken time to follow the work which is taking place. If nothing else, the huge earth-moving vehicles make it an attraction for small boys of all ages!

BVH will be at the RNLI Table-top Sale on Saturday July 1st. As well as talking about BVH, we will have some bric a brac and plants for sale. Do come along and have a chat.

As you will know, the local fishermen have set up the Lyme Bay Fishermen's Community Interest Company. One of their projects is a Scavenger Hunt across the area which aims to help people to recognise different species of fish. If you'd like to take part, you can find leaflets in the Fine Foundation Centre as well as local shops.

Natural Seaton will be on Saturday 22nd and Sunday 23rd July, in Seaton. We will be there, with our Jurassic Coast Trust hats on, to talk about the area to visitors to the event. We'll also have some child-related activities on offer. Natural Seaton is held annually, and features a wide range of organisations including Seaton Wetlands, the Undercliffs, Devon Wildlife Trust, and the RSPB. Lots of things to see and do, and well worth a visit.

Beer Quarry Caves is continuing with their programme of events. "Four of Swords" will be at the caves from $5^{th} - 15^{th}$ of July with their production of "Medea". More information available from the caves.

Thank you to everyone who keeps our beach so clean. If you'd like to do your own litter-pick there are litter pickers outside the building for you to borrow at any time. As well as the rubbish bins by Charlie's Yard, there are recycling bins on the eastern side of the centre.

As Beer Village Heritage is a registered charity, we rely on donations in order to run the Fine Foundation Centre and the Bomb Shelter. BEER PARISH COUNCIL

Dear All

Following a challenging start at the May meeting for the newly elected parish council, the June meeting of the council got off to an excellent start and concluded its business in a friendly and efficient manner. Helpful advice was received from the DCC representative, Cllr Marcus Hartnell, concerning traffic and parking issues near the primary school. The new EDDC representative John Heath has also been getting his teeth into many local issues.

There have been a few negative comments on social media concerning the makeup of the new council. Before the local council elections in May, four of the sitting councillors announced their decisions not to stand for re-election. In accordance with UK election procedures an advertisement was issued by the EDDC returning officer, for all those persons who qualified and wished to stand as Beer Parish Councillors to submit their application forms to him, by the due date. If there were more candidates applying than places available, a formal election would have to take place on the 4th of May. As it was, insufficient applications were made and in accordance with UK law, all of those who had applied were duly elected by the EDDC returning officer in a legal non contested election. Please note Beer Parish Council is not involved in this local election process.

At the start of the May Full Council meeting, a further four of the previous, and now newly re-elected Councillors, decided not to take up their posts, this then triggered the process to fill these vacancies. A notice was advertised informing residents that if 10 or more of the electorate requested it, further formal elections would be held. As no such requests were made in the allotted time, a different procedure now applies. These vacant posts have now been advertised and will now be filled by co-option. If insufficient applications are made, those persons who have applied will be co-opted directly onto the council. If there are more applications than places, the sitting elected Councillors conduct a secret ballot, to select the successful candidates for co-option. This is how the Parish Council has selected many of its members over the past four years, and in the preceding four year periods. If you care for the village and wish to make contribution to how it is run, please put your name

forward to the Clerk who will supply the necessary forms.

The June meeting also saw the reforming of the asset transfer working group, with four councillors and two members of the public confirmed, we require two further members of the public to join the working group. Please contact the Clerk:

beerparishcouncil@outlook.com if you are interested in joining the working group. The transfer of assets as per the original proposals, is now no longer an option due to changes in the application requirements by EDDC. The asset working groups new remit is to identify assets for transfer that will be of benefit to the village and will not place any financial burdens on it, to produce a properly costed business plan and proposals of how the assets will benefit and enhance the village and its residents to present to the Full Council. The Council also agreed to conduct a critical review of the asset transfer procedure to date, to inform residents what has been learnt, enabling a line to be drawn under the old proposals, and to give guidance to the working group in the future proposals.

A subject of concern to many in the village is the state of the Jubilee. On the 14th June there was a meeting on the Jubilee which was arranged by Cllr John Heath. The meeting was attended by representatives from EDDC and BPC Councillor John Heath. Between EDDC Cllr Jung, the person in charge of the Jubilee, four officers from EDDC, three Beer Parish councillors, representatives from the Horticultural Society, and several members of the public the views of the village were put forward and despite some initial reluctance, their views were modified by the strength of local feeling and by the end of the meeting things seem to be moving in a satisfactory direction.

Please remember that all are welcome at the next BPC meeting 12th July at 7.30pm in the Mariners Hall, there is always a public participation session at the start of the meeting, should you wish to bring anything before the council in person. As the Council do not meet in August, the next meeting will be on the 13th September 2023. DAYS

What are days for?
Days are where we live.
They come, they wake us
Time and time over.
They are to be happy in:
Where can we live but days?

Ah, solving that question Brings the priest and the doctor In their long coats Running over the fields.

Philip Larkin's 1953 poem opens a profound question. Is it possible to live outside the regular arrival of each day? If you manage three-score-and-ten years, then you'll have got through 25,550 of them.

It looks a bit like a sentence, doesn't it? A life enveloped in time.

In Larkin's mind, to ask if there is any other place to live summons the doctor and the priest. Ministers to the body and the soul.

Time is movement. Earth turns. The sun makes its way across the sky. Clouds form and dissolve. Your watch ticks on. You turn the pages of the diary. Each day presents its menu of events. They arrive and then they are past. Your body is a product of time; a glance in the mirror confirms that.

So the body is in time. But what about the consciousness? The awareness that looks out at the world through your eyes today is more knowledgeable and understanding than it was so many years ago, but it is the same awareness, the same being, the same consciousness. That consciousness does not depend upon time for its existence.


